

**Worcester and Norfolk District  
of the Massachusetts Senate  
An Information Sheet For Elections**

**Notes**

- Despite its name, this district does NOT include the city of Worcester or the town of Norfolk. Instead, it lies mostly in Worcester county plus the town of Bellingham in Norfolk county.
- The district spans 14 towns along the state's south central border, as shown on the list and map below. It is largely rural and forested land but with a long history of small industrial development.
- The district was created in 2011 when all of the state's legislative districts were redefined in response to the national census of 2010. The Senate districts were designed to each include about 163,691 people. Each of the 40 districts elects one Senator for 2 years with no term limits.
